Being able to provide alternatives that are available, when a student is facing academic difficulties, is very important. I must also know where to find answers to questions that I don't have answers to. We must help students explore strategies, so they can make good decisions. Requiring them to think and do for themselves is much more beneficial to them than simply telling and giving them all they need to know. I believe it is important to explore the learning styles of my students and to maintain a wealth of teaching strategies to address different learning styles.</p>
