Teaching Philosophy	I grew up in a family of educators and consequently have always been exposed to the profession of teaching. My students realize that I "have been there, done that" and what information and knowledge I want them to possess will truly benefit them as teachers. My students come to understand the importance but also the complexity of working with students with exceptionalities. In teaching my classes, I start with a more teacher led approach but welcome and encourage student participation. I attempt to engage the class in discussions and also promote higher order questioning/thinking activities. Unfortunately, these activities have to be somewhat limited due to the fact of a limited amount of time to address all course objectives. I realize that in directing the instructional content it is imperative that I try to utilize various techniques to meet the needs of visual, tactile, auditory learners. To meet these needs I use PowerPoint and the internet for visual learners, lectures for auditory learners, and manipulatives for the tactile learners.
