**Hard to staff schools:**

The school district face challenges in filling teacher vacancies, in part because of our rural, impoverished locations. Schools that are geographically isolated present obvious challenges for recruiting and retaining teachers—few qualified teachers live there, and these areas can be difficult to reach even for teachers who are willing to commute. Teaching experience, certification test pass rates for area degreed persons outside of education, competitiveness of undergraduate institution with other districts.
