	<b>Summary:</b> As classrooms become more diverse, it is important to meet students' varied learning needs; however, there is a concern regarding inequities in gifted education. Specifically,
	underrepresentation of various populations is a persistent issue in
	gifted education that needs to be addressed. Rigorous curriculum is one way to foster student learning while supporting gifted and
	talented potential but can be challenging to implement. One solution
	to the challenge of implementing rigorous curriculum is by utilizing
	multiple adults in the same classroom. In this Capstone, I addressed
	a problem of practice on both a macro and micro scale aimed at
	gaining greater understanding of the roles of multiple adults working
	together in a classroom. Research findings included the actions and interactions of multiple adults and patterns between adults and the
	implementation of a rigorous curriculum.
